A Statutory Voice For Zanzibar's Legal Profession

The Zanzibar Law Society is the statutory professional society established under the Zanzibar Law Society Act No. 7 of 2019. It represents advocates, promotes ethical and competent practice, and provides an organised channel through which legal expertise can contribute to justice-sector development, legislation, public policy and Zanzibar's wider business environment.



Vision

ZLS seeks to be a strong, forward-thinking institution that leads on the role of law and lawyers in society. It connects professional excellence with public confidence, capable justice institutions and a profession able to respond to Zanzibar's changing legal, social and economic needs.



Mission

The mission is to represent, advance and defend the interests of the legal profession and the public. ZLS therefore combines member services, CLE and CPD, institutional and law-firm upscaling, professional standards, policy dialogue, legal information and collaboration on access to justice across Unguja and Pemba.



A Concise Institutional Record

1999 Public records identify 1999 as ZLS's organisational starting point. This era created the professional platform from which the Society's statutory role later developed.

2019 Act No. 7 of 2019 established the current statutory framework. It clarified the Society's legal identity, objects and institutional affairs.

2026 By February 2026, the supplied roll recorded 1,484 cumulative admissions; ZLS separately reported about 500 registered members. This era added professional Secretariat and partner-facing delivery.

The cumulative Advocates' Roll records historical admissions; it is not the active ZLS membership count.

ZLS preserves independent judgment while engaging institutions through informed dialogue and legal analysis. Practical solutions remain the goal.

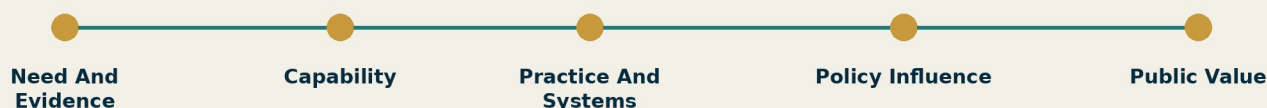
Inclusive And Public-Facing

Institutional Growth And Success Stories, 1999-2026

1999

Organisational Roots

Public records identify 1999 as ZLS's organisational starting point. It created a collective platform for Zanzibar's advocates. That foundation sustained professional voice until the statutory model adopted 20 years later.

2019

Statutory Foundation

Act No. 7 of 2019 established the current statutory Society. It defined ZLS's identity, objects and affairs. The law converted professional organisation into a durable public-interest mandate.

By 2026

Professional Secretariat

The supplied story records a shift from council-led operations to a professional Secretariat. Governance and delivery systems were strengthened. One Chief Executive Officer was recruited, clarifying oversight and implementation.

Feb 2026

Reach And Continuity

The supplied Roll records 1,484 cumulative admissions from January 1919 to February 2026. ZLS separately reports about 500 members. The figures show historical continuity and a defined professional community.

26th AGM

Digital Justice Leadership

In 2026, ZLS convened its 26th Annual Conference and General Meeting on digital transformation and accessible justice. It linked professional standards with e-filing and case management. ZLS demonstrated justice-modernisation leadership.

Government Partnership

The supplied April 2026 account records four outcomes: legal-sector support, legal-aid collaboration, land and a minibus. These commitments signal institutional trust. They demonstrate confidence in ZLS's public mandate and delivery.

Quarterly learning can address emerging law, commercial practice, advocacy and ethics. Partners earn credible thought-leadership space by answering verified professional needs.

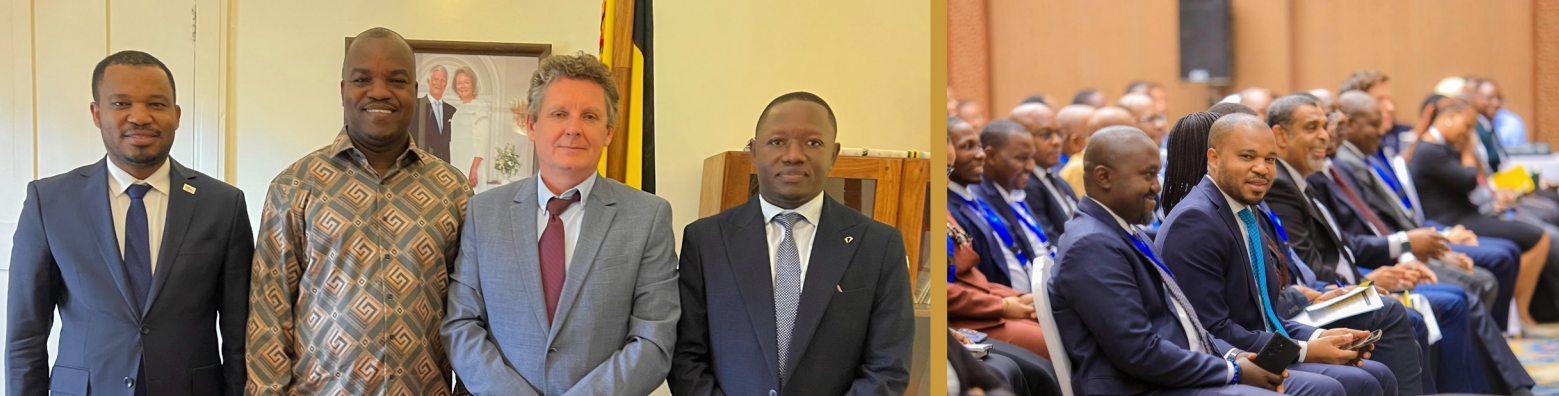
06 Inclusive Justice And Public Literacy

The Partnership Proposition

ZLS offers a statutory platform, approximately 500 registered members, independent legal expertise and access across the profession and public institutions. Partners bring complementary expertise, resources and implementation discipline. Together, the parties define outputs, safeguard professional independence and report evidence of reach, learning, institutional change and public value.



Partnership Platforms And Measurable Return
